

#### 2.0 OPENING:

The Chairman called the meeting to order, calling on Tpl. Anne Okuyemi FNITP, for opening prayer at exactly 2:20 pm. The Chairman, Tpl. Dr. David Olawale FNITP welcomed all Member Firms. He presented the agenda to guide the deliberation of the meeting.

Tpl. Moses Ogunleye FNITP, raised observation that numbers 14, 15 and 16 ought not to be in the agenda; stating that the Constitution only grants two-year term to the Executive not one year.

Tpl. Anne Okuyemi, FNITP moved the motion for the adoption of the agenda for the meeting as amended, was seconded by Tpl. Kola Olufade MNITP.

#### 3.0 OBITUARIES

The chairman informed the meeting that one of the heads of member firms was called to eternal glory in person of Tpl C.K. George FNITP, Principal Partner of Spectroplan Consult. Subsequently a condolence visit was made to the family on behalf of the Association by the Executive Committee Members. A minute silence was observed in honour of the departed soul.





#### **READING AND ADOPTION OF 2023 AGM:**

Minutes of the last AGM were read by the secretary. Tpl. Makinde Ogunleye FNITP noted that names with number 51, 52, and 53 were not our members but they were External Auditors. Names with 23-26 were not ASA but should be written as Adesanya Salako & Associates. Tpl. Moses Ogunleye FNITP, PPATOPCON noted that 31 should not be ATOPCON National but Admin Officer, also the name should appear on the attendance sheet of the member firms. Number 11 should be corrected as Innovative & inclusive Planning Services. The motion for adoption of the minutes of the meeting as amended was moved by Tpl. Toba Oyebanji, FNITP and seconded by Tpl. Toyin Ayinde FNITP, PPATOPCON

#### **CHAIRMAN'S REMARK AND OTHER REPORTS:**

The Chairman made his remark as contained on pages 8-10 of the program. He requested that all other reports be presented so that members could respond to the reports altogether. He also requested that the External Auditor should present the financial audited report to the whole house. The Secretary presented his report on pages 11-14 while the External Auditor; Gafari Musiliyu & Co (Chartered Accountant) presented the financial audited

#### **OBSERVATIONS AND COMMENTS FROM THE REPORTS:**

report for the year ended December 31 2023 on pages 19-25.

The motion for all reports to be adopted for discussion was moved by Tpl. Tayo Awomosu, FNITP and supported by Tpl. Sanni Kamil, FNITP.

- Tpl. Muyiwa Adeolu FNITP observed that he expected the report on Memorandum of Understanding signed on building project between the ATOPCON, LSB and NITP, LSC to be concluded in the report was not mentioned. He also alluded that there is nothing wrong if Internal Auditor presents his report which the External Auditor will validate or state otherwise.
- Tpl. Dele Akindele FNITP, asked a question on the Secretary's report about what steps had been taken against unethical practice and impersonation, he alluded that it was not enough to report cloning/impersonation but the report must also state the steps taken.
- Tpl. Hakeem Badejo FNITP, commended the executive for the job well done for the period of one year in office. However, he clamoured for a downward review of CSR from 20% to 10% to allow for more funding, the building project can have more funds and be progressive. He further suggested that those using the Association's account for illicit deposit of funds for speculation purposes should have the funds forfeited to the Association. He also mentioned that any member firm found culpable of unethical practice should be referred to the appropriate quarters.
- Tpl. Tayo Awomosu, FNITP was of the opinion that the LUPAR fee was due for upward review.

- Chairman responded to all observations while Tpl. Awomosu, FNITP gave further explanations on the ongoing process to review the LUPAR fee.
  - Tpl. Moses Ogunleye, FNITP also advised that we should not use the (phrase; review of professional fees). He pinpointed that only TOPREC has the power to review professional fees. He however noted that we can follow what the SURVEYORS did by calling it Policy Guideline. The External Auditor also responded to questions and observations raised by members.

#### 7.0 UNVEILING OF THE ASSOCIATION'S WEBSITE:

The website developer, Mr. Bolaji Afolabi presented the Association's website to the house and displayed its operational processes to members. Thereafter, Tpl. Moses Ogunleye FNITP, PPATOPCON unveiled and commissioned it for usage.

#### 8.0 AOB

- Tpl. Toba Oyebanji FNITP observed that considering the fund coming to the Association purse, our AGM fee should be at a minimum rate to encourage member firms.
- Tpl. Dele Akindele FNITP, observed that the picture used for the cover page did not depict the Town Planning profession, he suggested that pictures such as development plans should be displayed on the cover page.
- In response to this observation, the Chairman responded to the observations and also briefed the house that a letter was written to the Association by LASPPPA informing us that LUPAR would be vetted.

#### 9.0 MOTION FOR ADJOURNMENT

- Motion for adjournment was moved by Tpl. Moses Ogunleye FNITP, PPATOPCON and seconded by Tpl. Muyiwa Adelu FNITP, PPATOPCON.

#### 0.0 CLOSING

Closing prayer was said by Tpl. S.A Yusuf FNITP. The meeting came to a close at 4.25 pm.

# PRESENTED BY TPL. DR. DAVID AKINYEMI OLAWALE, FNITP, CMILT AT THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD ON TUESDAY MAY 27TH, 2025 OUR ACCOUNTS OF STEWARDSHIP PROTOCOLS

#### 1.0 BACKGROUND

"For everything that has a beginning, the end will surely come one day". This is a clear indication that, the journey that started 2 years ago, is coming to an end today.

The journey of 2 years full of experiences, loaded with challenges and successes. However, we give glory to God who has been our source of inspiration and strength.

Our appreciation goes to individuals, member firms and most importantly our various committee Chairmen and Members for your unwavering supports towards the various programs of the Association in the last one year. This session of the AGM is the period where we are going to present our accounts of stewardship for the last 12 calendar months. Adebisi Ogunlewe, FNITP who always making sure that our members have soft landing over there when the applications go to their office. In total, 23 new firms were presented from this branch to national council of ATOPCON for membership registration during the year under review. Special appreciation to the President of ATOPCON; Tpl. Adebisi Adedire, FNITP for his usual support.

#### 3.0 COURTESY VISITS, PARTNERSHIPS AND ENGAGEMENTS

Partnerships are key to achieving goals in any organisation. As part of our campaign promises and our words of assurance in the acceptance speech where it was clearly stated that, this administration will work to strengthen existing partnerships with relevant organisations. During the year under review, the Executive Committee and Members of the Association have been able to pay courtesy visits to the following offices; Honourable Commissioner and Permanent Secretary, Ministries of Physical Planning and Urban Development, GM, Lagos State Planning Permits Authority, GM, Lagos State Urban Renewal Agency, GM, Lagos State Informal Space Management Authority and S.A, E-GIS and Urban Development. Our collaboration with the Institute at the State Chapter level is more cordial during the year under review. The essence of all these is to foster the existing relationships and seek to establish new ones that can help us achieve our objectives for the betterment of our environment, advocacy for the profession and more job creation amongst others.

#### 4.0 ADVOCACY THROUGH COLLABORATION

The Association during the year under review has intensify efforts in the area of advocacy by collaborating with government establishments on programmes and events amongst which include: World Habitat Day

Celebration; Corporate Social Responsibility partnership with Ministry of Physical Planning and Urban Development, Lagos State Physical Planning Permit Authority, and Media engagements amongst others in order to make the Association more visible and to gain more recognition.

#### 5.0 CAPACITY BUILDING

#### 5.1 Drone and Mapping Training

In fulfilment of our administrations promises in the area of capacity building in order to encourage training and retraining of heads and staffs of member firms as well as fostering the relationship with the state government. The Association organised trainings on Drone and Mapping. These trainings were geared towards equipping us with necessary tools and knowledge for the current realities in consultancy.

#### 5.2 GIS and Mapping

Another important capacity development effort during the year under review is the two (2) days training on GIS and Mapping. This training was well attended by member firms, staff of Ministry of Physical Planning and Urban Development and Young Planners Forum members.

#### 5.3 One Day Workshop

The Association during the year under review was able to organise a professional development workshop which is the **first of its kind** at the State Branch Level. Total of 163 participants were in attendance. The workshop was organised to improve on our deliverables as Town Planners. A central focus of the workshop is "IMPOVING STANDARDS OF PHYSICAL PLANNING DELIVERABLES" Renowned Town Planners were invited as resource persons for the workshop.

#### 6.0 PROFESSIONAL PRACTISE

#### 6.1 Policy Guide for Remuneration of Town Planning Consultancy Services in Lagos State

With the collaboration of NITP, LSC, the Association was able to develop a policy guide for remuneration of Town Planning Consultancy Services in Lagos State. The policy guide was prepared in an attempt to standardise the fees chargeable by Consultants on various service deliveries by Town Planners. The document was published in December 2024 and commenced implementation from January 2025.

Several feedbacks were received on the policy guide implementation and we are still trying to navigate through some of them.

#### 6.2 Upward Review of Remuneration of Town Planning Consultancy Services in Lagos State through **Policy Guide**

Another major achievement of this administration is the upward review of the fees chargeable by Consultants in Lagos State. This was done in collaboration with the NITP, LSC in order to standardise the practise, ensure quality delivery and to also improve the welfare package of our members. This upward review has helped members to earn adequately for the services being rendered.

#### 7.0 PROJECTS

#### 7.1 NITP-Joseph Awogbemi House Redevelopment/Temporary Office

In furtherance of our effort to have a befitting secretariat building for our Association that will further improve our image and provide good accommodation for our activities as well as life investment for the Association. The Association has been able donate reasonable amount towards the on-going joint

redevelopment of the NITP-Joseph Awogbemi House. The building construction is still on-going and presently at the roofing level. We hope to complete this in good time.

The temporary secretariat that was acquired in conjunction with NITP, LSC which had since been occupied before the commencement of construction of our secretariat rent was renewed in September, 2024. The bill was shared equally among the two (2) bodies. Further details of the expenses in the Financial Report.

#### 7.2 Femi Olomola Annual Lecture Series

The second edition of Femi Olomola Lecture Series was jointly organised by ATOPCON, LSB and NITP, LSC during the year under review. The lecture was well attended by members, Olomola family and members of public. The lecture was adjudged a huge success. More details in the Secretary's report.

#### 7.3 Website Development

The Association website is functioning well with up-to-date information. During the year under review, the QR code was developed as a second level security measure for the LUPAR Authentication/Certification Form. This was embedded on the website thereby making confirmation of authenticity of the forms used and submitted by members possible. We continually upload some useful documents and materials into our elibrary on the website for use of members and the public.

We are glad to report to the whole house that, ATOPCON Lagos State Branch website is functioning well (www.atopconlagos.org). This is boosting the image of the Association at large and individual member firms as we are all linked to the website.

#### 8.0 FINANCE

Lagos State Branch of the Association has maintained a robust and effective financial status throughout the year under review. Our sources of income are regularly maintained as well as prudency in expenditure. Our investment account has increased greatly during the year. Many thanks to our members for your supports in this regards.

#### 9.0 CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

During the year under review, the Association was stronger in terms of corporate social responsibility to government agencies, NITP, YPF, and AWTPN amongst others. This was an attempt to further strengthen the relationship with these bodies as well as given ATOPCON more recognition. Kudos to all our members for your unwavering support towards this exercise.

#### **SECRETARY'S REPORT**

#### **Protocols**

I give thanks to God for making this day a reality for us all; and for the opportunity to witness the year - 2025 Annual General Meeting (AGM), of the Association of Town Planning Consultants of Nigeria (ATOPCON), Lagos State Branch (LSB). I also want to sincerely appreciate God's endowed privilege(s) to serve as the secretary of our great Association.

I would like to express my sincere appreciation to all our fellows and members of Nigerian Institute of Town Planners (NITP), and Association of Town Planning Consultants of Nigeria (ATOPCON), most essentially, our respected Head of Town Planning Firms in Lagos State, and their illustrious staff members here seated. I thank you all, for your unwavering support and the accorded opportunity to serve in this capacity. Also, my hearty appreciation goes to all our renowned ATOPCON's past presidents and chairmen for your steadfast efforts, in growing the association to its currently attained level of success. It is my torrid prayer that, the Almighty God will continue to shine His light on our town planning professional practice, with a view to creating a better environment for the benefits of humanity.

The Association's assessment score-card in the period under review showed a whopping 95% achievement of this administration's targeted goal. The compendium of the Association's activities are comprehensively reported as detailed below:

#### 1.0 LEADERSHIP TRAINING

The Association's Executive Committee attended the Leadership Training programme organised by the NITP National Body at Abeokuta, Ogun State on July 9<sup>th</sup>, 2024. This training serves as a breeding ground, in upgrading our leadership skills during the One Day Leadership Retreat; thus, the certificate of attendance were presented.

#### 2.0 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING

During the period under review, a total of 12 Executive Committee meetings and three (3) emergency meetings were held. The meetings recorded huge successes with the minimum of 80% attendance, while the highest was 100% in most times. The meeting aids the decision-making process, management and implementation of the Association's programmes and policies.

#### 3.0 ADMINISTRATION OF LUPAR FORMS

The LUPAR implementation and administration has demonstrated a good standard of policy guidelines and probity in its operations. The LUPAR information is shared with LASPPPA office regularly, while the schedule contains name of firms, project's location and local government area, including the forms serial numbers among others. Averagely, about 300 to 700 forms were submitted by consultants monthly, with the exception of the Amnesty period that recorded higher number of submissions. Administratively, LUPAR book and record keeping, prevention of unethical practices, transparency and accountability are our watch-words.



#### 4.0 MEMBERSHIPGROWTH

#### 5.0 COLLABORATION ON FEMI OLOMOLAANNUALLECTURE

The ATOPCON LSB, in partnership with NITP, LSC collaborated on Femi Olomola Annual Lecture series held on July 30<sup>th</sup>, 2024 at the Academy Inn at Agidingbi, Ikeja. Further to this, the partnership is strengthened through a signed Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on Femi Olomola Annual Lectures and other associated programmes. The Memorandum of Understanding spelt out how the ATOPCON, LSB and NITP, LSC would jointly contribute and manage the account for this purpose.

#### 6.0 COURTESY VISITS AND ENGAGEMENTS

The ATOPCON, LSB Exco engages in her corporate social responsibility, while it pays courtesy visits to the following offices; essentially, GM, Lagos State Urban Renewal Agency (LASURA) - Tpl. Animashaun Oladimeji and GM, Lagos State Incidental Open Space Management Authority (LASISMA) - Tpl. Daisi Osho. Similarly, the Executive Committee had been on continuous engagements with the GM, Lagos State Physical Planning Permit Authority (LASPPPA) amongst other stakeholders. The EXCO's visit centres on issues of practice and other related matters. Also, the collaboration between ATOPCON, LSB with NITP, Lagos State Chapter is quite cordial; and fosters better relationships, in creating an improved town planning practice in the State.

#### 7.0 FUND INVESTMENT

The Executive Committee of the Association during the year under review, had previously invested the Association's fund with investment companies. To this extent, a sum of 30 million naira was invested with private investment companies namely, Meristem Wealth Investment Limited; making a total of N100 million investment in all till date. This include the sum with Cedrus Group Africa and United Capital respectively. It is important to state that, the investment had yielded approximately 20 million naira altogether during this administration tenure (See the financial report for more information).

#### 8.0 CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT

#### 8.1 Geographic Information System (GIS) Training

Regarding the capacity building during the year under review, the Executive Committee of ATOPCON LSB organised capacity training on Geographic Information System. This was designed to boost capacity development, through training and re-training of Head and staff of member firms, including the relevant Ministry's officers; thus fosters improved relationship with the state government. The Geographic Information System Training was held on Tuesday, 19<sup>th</sup> to Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> of November, 2024. The training had in its attendance, eighty (80) participants, which signifies a huge success as tools for improved consultancy services. This is to ensure consultants are abreast of the current realities in town planning professional practices.



#### 8.2 Workshop

Furthermore, workshop was organised in the areas of current realities among the member firms and their staff members. The workshop engaged six (6) resource persons with different sub-themes, focusing on improved standard of Physical Planning Deliverables. The Workshop was held on the 13th February, 2025 and attended by over 100 participants. Members were exposed to various areas of professional practice concerning service delivery.

#### 9.0 PROJECTS

#### 9.1 NITP-Joseph Awogbemi House Redevelopment Project

On Pa Joseph Awogbemi House Re-development project, the ATOPCON LSB in partnership with NITP, LSC collaborated to sponsor the project. Presently, the project is at the 5<sup>th</sup> floor concrete slab, and 6<sup>th</sup> floor column. Importantly, this administration within two years had contributed its counterpart funding to the tune of N270 million on the project. Documentation wise, the ATOPCON LSB and NITP LSC had signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU), concerning the project. This centres on project funding and office space sharing formula; and the agreement is faithfully respected, by the two parties up to date.

#### 9.2 Map Referencing and Storage Facility

The Executive Committee had purchased two computer systems with high grade specification (Hp PAV 27 DOO79nh INTEL CORE: 7 2TB HDD 16GB RAM 4GB NVIDIA GRAPHICS WIN 11 27 TOUCH SCREEN S/V:S/N:8C Q2080X0,2YD). The computer systems are to serve as a central base map reference spot for data gathering, storage and retrieval of information in soft copy. These systems are to domicile at the ATOPCON, Lagos State Branch Secretariat; and the Lagos State Physical Planning Permit Authority (LASPPPA) office. The purpose is to achieve a seamless LUPAR operations in Lagos state.

#### 9.2 Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR)

The Association during the period under review carried out some of her corporate social responsibilities via its contribution towards an improved working environment of our Distinguished Professional Colleagues. Notable amongst these include the ATOPCON LSB Practice Committee, and the Adhoc Committee on Joint ATOPCON LSB /NITP LSC Practice Committee, Committee on LUPAR Implementation, Rebranding Committee and Base Map Referencing Committee. These Committees performed excellently well.

#### 12.0 UNACHIEVED GOAL

As part of the vision that this administration earlier had at inception is to set-up and inaugurate ATOPCON, Lagos State Branch Housing Department. This department is expected to be in charge of the Association's Real Estate Investment. The aim of the Executive Committee was to have a lasting legacy that will speak volume, concerning the Town Planning Profession from generation to generation. #### REPORT ON THE CREATION OF ATOPCON DATABASE


I am pleased to announce that the Association has successfully created a database to manage its data. This database will improve our association's operations and increase our efficiency and effectiveness.


